- Ukraine is the official name.
- Ukraine is the one of largest countries in Europe by area at 603,628 km (233,062 sq. mi).
- The capital city is Kiev.
- Ukrainian is the official language of Ukraine. But half of the population speaks in Russian.
- The main National holiday is Independence Day (24 August). On that day, in 1991 Ukraine broke away from the Soviet Union (from the huge Russian empire).
- In February 2014, Russia made a military attempt to subjugate Ukraine again, but met with the heroic resistance of the Ukrainians. War between Ukraine and Russia is still not over.
- About 42 million people live in Ukraine now.
- Petro Poroshenko is the President of Ukraine.

Fun Facts

- Ukraine produces the largest aircraft in the world - An-225 "Mriya". It can carry 250 tons of cargo!
- Popular American Christmas melody "Carol of the Bells" was created in Ukraine (famous Ukrainian composer M. Leontovich.)
- There is a very original holiday called "Old New Year". It is celebrated on the night of 13 on January 14. Nobody works these days.

Famous People

1. Igor Sikorsky (1889 - 1972) - Ukrainian-American pioneer of aviation. In 1939 he designed and flew the first viable helicopter in the world.
2. Mykola Amosov (1913 - 2002) - Doctor of Science, Professor, a Soviet Ukrainian doctor, heart surgeon, known for his inventions of several surgical procedures for treating heart defects.

Facts

- With an area of 92,043 square miles (238,391 square kilometers), Romania is the largest country in Southeastern Europe. It is roughly the same size as the United Kingdom and slightly smaller than the U.S. state of Oregon.
- The name “Romania” comes from the Latin word “Romanus” which means “citizen of the Roman Empire”.
- The capital city is Bucharest, was also known as Little Paris during the interwar period, because of its elegant architecture.
- In Bucharest, you’ll find the second largest building in the world, the Palace of Parliament.
- According to Top Gear, Romania is home to one of the most beautiful roads in the world: the Transfagarasan.
- Romania was the only communist country in the Warsaw Pact to violently put an end to the country’s communist reign and overthrew the government with force.
- Romania is Europe’s richest country in gold resources.
- National Day: December 1st (Great Union Day).

Fun Facts

- The real Dracula (Vlad Draculea) nicknamed Vlad Tepes (Vlad the Impaler) was a Romanian prince and military leader who fought bravely against the invading Turkish army in the mid 1400's.
- The Merry Cemetery (or the Happy Graveyard) in Maramureş, is one of the world's most unique resting places. It is famous for its over 800 colorful gravestones, decorated with colorful paintings and funny epitaphs about the deceased.
- The earliest Homo sapiens fossils, up to now, were discovered in 2002 in southwestern Romania, in the Cave of Bones. The fossils’ age is estimated at 37,800 to 42,000 years old.

1. Stefan Odobleja (1902 -1978) - The creator of psycho cybernetics and the father of generalized cybernetics.
2. Petrache Poenaru (1799-1875) - Invented and patented the fountain pen, which is used around the world today.
